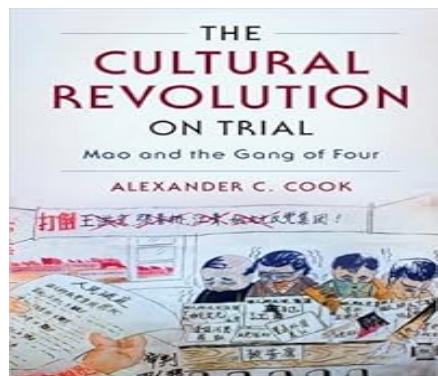


The Cultural Revolution on trialon corporation
