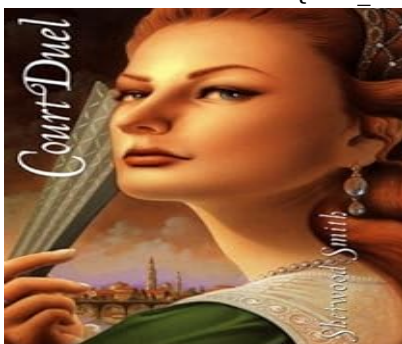


Court Duel (Crown Court, #2) By Sherwood Smith **Book Court duelist** I will admit even though he was described as having very long light blond hair I just had to imagine him with dark hair because I could not get Lucias Mayfoy's image from the Harry Potter movies out of my mind. **Book Court duel links** hypocritical?
