English This book falls between various stools. **Perversion of justice book** Epstein's rise from his first job as an unqualified teacher to a billionaire able to hire multiple lawyers offer substantial bribes and marshal influential contacts is described but never explained. **Perversion of justice book** The reader begins to tire of being told the actual number of multi page depositions the author had to plough her way through the difficulties of juggling her personal and family life and the condition of some of the hotels she stayed in during her investigations. **Perversion of justice book** The Epstein case has received so much publicity I fear that it isn't but what other options do we have? English The author's divorce rent and child rearing difficulties are not interesting. **Perversion of justice book** The reason I only gave it three stars is because if I had a dollar for every personal pronoun this author uses in telling the Epstein story I would be an incredibly wealthy individual. **Perversion of justice book** Do I really need to know about her relationship with her boyfriend that her daughter plays five instruments or that she wrote good essays in elementary school? The book is than four hundred pages long. **Perversion of justice book** Perversion of Justice delves into the following proposition: "someone so evil was able to manipulate so many people" in high places and get away with abusing and exploiting teenage "waif" girls from troubled homes or homeless and sleeping under freeway underpasses paying them \$300 for their "massage" sessions and doing these crimes against hundreds upon hundreds of girls leaving a wake of destruction in their path. **Perversion of justice book** As a reporter for the Miami Herald Brown explains that she got into journalism to fight for justice and that the enablers of Epstein's predation just as bad as the predation itself compelled her to do a deep dive into the craven cowardice and enabling that allows a super predator like Epstein to get away with his crimes even as he continues his predatory ways. **Perversion of justice book** Brown's passion and personal connection to the material gives the narratives and reportage emotional power and she never loses sight of the victims their ongoing struggle their horror at seeing a system that favors the predator over the victim and their attempt to tell their stories and process the chaos that has become of their lives. **Perversion of justice book** Brown makes it clear that Epstein a man of exceptional brilliance and manipulation skills (and "the inflated ego of a mad scientist) had so much money he could have paid for the most expensive services but that he desired the cruelty of terrifying the innocent the troubled and the helpless. **Perversion of justice book** He was so grotesque that the girls rather than continue their services preferred to work as go betweens recruiting other girls to do the services they no longer wished to perform. **Perversion of justice book** For those of you looking for an expose on Epstein's death you'll have to read to page 390 in a chapter titled "Jeffrey Epstein Didn't Kill Himself" in which Brown observes how implausible suicide

was under the circumstances including how Epstein's broken and fractured bones are not consistent with hanging. **Perversion of justice book** An excellent journalistic piece of work though which will hopefully result in the truth finally being exposed and hopefully lead to his co conspirators being identified and brought to justice. **Perversion of justice book** Brown recounts her uncompromising and risky investigation of Jeffrey Epstein's underage sex trafficking operation and the explosive reporting for the Miami Herald that finally brought him to justice while exposing the powerful people and broken system that protected him. **Perversion of justice book** Pouring over thousands of redacted court documents travelling across the country and chasing down information in difficulty and sometimes dangerous circumstances Brown tracked down dozens of Epstein's victims now young women struggling to reclaim their lives after the trauma and shame they had endured. **Perversion of justice book** Brown's resulting three part series in the Miami Herald was one of the most explosive news stories of the decade revealing how Epstein ran a global sex trafficking pyramid scheme with impunity for years targeting vulnerable teens often from fractured homes and then turning them into recruiters. **Perversion of justice book** Tracking Epstein's evolution from a college dropout to one of the most successful financiers in the country whose associates included Donald Trump Prince Andrew and Bill Clinton **Perversion of Justice** builds on Brown's original award winning series showing the power of truth the value of local reportage and the tenacity of one woman in the face of the deep seated corruption of powerful men:

This book covers comprehensively the Jeffrey Epstein affair. **Perversion of justice book** It is well written and a real page turner revealing the most shocking corruption of the justice system in the US going right to the very top. **Perversion of justice book** English This book gave me some new insights into the Epstein case and I found it a good read, **Perversion of justice book** Like one or two others I found the autobiographical sections contributed to the book's one or two flat spots but I understand why an author would want to do it. **Perversion of justice book** The only real irritation (from an Englishman's point of view) was the frequent use of American English, **Perversion of justice book** The author has investigated some of them and writes authoritatively about her own work with just the barest mention of aspects outside her own purview. **Perversion of justice book** According to the title the book ought to explain how Epstein was able through his extreme wealth and extensive powerful connections to pervert justice: **Perversion of justice book** The reader is left wondering how he really made his money and how he achieved such a hold over powerful men, **Perversion of justice book** Added to the disappointment of the book's content it shows every sign of being thrown together hurriedly: **Perversion of justice book** Perhaps it's the Kindle edition but many proper nouns including names and surnames are not capitalised. **Perversion of justice book** The reader wants a story about justice or the lack thereof not gossip: **Perversion of justice book** English Though this is a fascinating and repugnant story that the author tells it is detailed convincing and well worth reading, **Perversion of justice book** When Theodore Roosevelt wrote his memoirs about the Spanish American War he suffered from this same deficiency and a critic claimed

that it should have been titled "Alone in Cuba: **Perversion of justice book** Brown took a story of this repulsive perverted man of wealth who used the system and overwhelms the reader with all of her uses of "I" and "me". **Perversion of justice book** Still this should be read since the facts are compelling and outrageous: **Perversion of justice book** A cautionary tale of injustice and a heart rending story of all the young women who were abused and used. **Perversion of justice book** One wishes all of those men who participated in his debauchery were in prison too, **Perversion of justice book** English I looked forward to this book after hearing the author on NPR: **Perversion of justice book** While the sections on the Epstein investigation are interesting so much of the book is a boring recitation of her life: **Perversion of justice book** A good editor would have stripped out all her personal anecdotes minimized the 'I' and my littered throughout the book and narrowed the focus to the Epstein investigation. **Perversion of justice book** Yes it might have shrunk the book to maybe 200 pages but it would have made the book so much interesting. **Perversion of justice book** I find myself skipping over pages because her personal life is not why I purchased her book and is quite frankly I find her stories annoying, **Perversion of justice book** English My interest in Jeffrey Epstein's epic predatory criminality was sparked by the Netflix documentary Filthy Rich which explores these very crimes and Epstein's evasion from justice, **Perversion of justice book** Brown had written a book about the case I eagerly read it. **Perversion of justice book** What makes Epstein's ongoing impunity from the law remarkable Brown observes is that he committed these crimes when the FBI was allegedly cracking down on this type of trafficking: **Perversion of justice book** In other words he was a force of evil with friends of all political persuasions from Donald Trump to Bill Clinton: **Perversion of justice book** We get a detailed look of Epstein's crime scene a West Palm Beach mansion with surveillance cameras. **Perversion of justice book** The mansion was essentially a predatory palace lined with photographs of the rich and famous to let the girls know they were in the halls of power. **Perversion of justice book** For over a decade this mansion was used with the help of Ghislaine Maxwell to lure hundreds of poor teens to give their services to Epstein. **Perversion of justice book** Its grotesqueries are always in the service of giving justice to the victims. **Perversion of justice book** Brown shows us the painful interviews she has with some of the victims and gives us a sense of the long term wreckage and exhaustion of living these nightmares, **Perversion of justice book** Sometimes Brown returns to her place from an interview and breaks down into tears. **Perversion of justice book** But she continues with the hard work of exposing a society that gives a free pass to the rich and as such proves itself to be morally bankrupt, **Perversion of justice book** She makes no claim to knowing the exact cause of death but writes "it's hard to believe someone who believed he was always above the law would give up so easily: **Perversion of justice book** " In other words suicide would not be consistent with the sociopath so persuasively rendered in Brown's compelling reportage, **Perversion of justice book** English A very detailed account of the story behind the crimes of Jeffrey Epstein and his associates. **Perversion of justice book** Absolutely dreadful accounts of how these young girls were abused and how it was all covered up by powerful men in the main, **Perversion of justice book** One really doesn't want to believe that money and power can be so corrupt in a civilised democratic country: **Perversion of justice book** As a British citizen I honestly believe that it would not be so easy to evade justice within the British legal system, **Perversion of justice book** I also believe that had Epstein died within the British penal system there would have been a very thorough investigation into the circumstances of his death, **Perversion of justice book** I believe that Ghislaine Maxwell will be dealt with in a far thorough and punitive manner being British and a female: **Perversion of justice book** It is however right that she be punished fully if found to be guilty of the crimes of which she has been accused: **Perversion of justice book** She also provides the American justice system with the opportunity to provide these young women with the justice that they deserve: **Perversion of justice book** With regards to the written aspect of the book it really needs to be edited effectively, **Perversion of justice book** The lack of capital letters throughout the book was extremely annoying and detracted from the serious nature of the text. **Perversion of justice book** It appeared to be a very juvenile immature form of writing as if it had been hastily written and no attention given to

presentation. **Perversion of justice book** It was also quite rambling in style in places and I'm afraid that towards the end I began to skim read the pages. **Perversion of justice book** For many years billionaire Jeffrey Epstein's penchant for teenage girls was an open secret in the high society of Palm Beach Florida and Upper East Side Manhattan: **Perversion of justice book** Charged in 2008 with soliciting prostitution from minors Epstein was treated with unheard of leniency dictating the terms of his non prosecution: **Perversion of justice book** The media virtually ignored the failures of the criminal justice system and Epstein's friends and business partners brushed the allegations aside. **Perversion of justice book** S Attorney who approved Epstein's plea deal Alexander Acosta was chosen by President Trump as Labor Secretary reporter Julie K. **Perversion of justice book** Despite her editors scepticism that she could add a new dimension to a known story Brown determined that her goal would be to track down the victims themselves. **Perversion of justice book** The outrage led to Epstein's arrest the disappearance and eventual arrest of his closest accomplice Ghislaine Maxwell and the resignation of Acosta. The title of the book is very apt and says it all. But overall though a good read. It is not a full review of Jeffrey Epstein's crimes. But it fails in this too. The book merely leaves these questions unanswered. It is poorly written and even poorly edited. Especially since she isn't very likable. Her prejudices are obvious." Well Julie K.
