A brilliantly detailed visual representation of one of the greatest US warships the USS Iowa whose four decades in service took her from the Pacific War in World War II to the Persian Gulf in the late 1980s. **The Battleship USS Iowa book bash** This new addition to the Anatomy of the Ship series is illustrated with contemporary photographs scaled plans of the ship and hundreds of superb 3D illustrations which bring every detail of this historic battleship to life. **PDF The Battleship USS iowa** Previous volumes I own in this series such as the books on the Hood Warspite and Dreadnought have contained machinery chapters with many drawings of boilers engines pumps condensers as well as steam pipes and fuel flow diagrams. **The Battleship USS Iowa bookstore apparel** I know some books such as those on the Yamato and Fuso also do not have machinery chapters but the authors have pointed out that this is because the plans were destroyed at the end of the war and the ships in question are at the bottom of the ocean. **The Battleship USS Iowa kindle cloud** Anyone familiar with the Superdrawings in 3D books will recognise the CAD drawings in the book as being of a similar standard and the exterior of the ship is well served in this respect but I feel the internal drawings are too small. **Battleship uss iowa general access pass 1472827295** Fantastic reference for model builders 1472827295 Whilst this book is one that tries to give the reader a fairly good idea of what such a powerful and beautiful warship was like plus the many changes made to it there are too many coloured drawings that would have been replaced by photographs seeing as the Iowa is now a floating museum so I'm sure that modern photographic techniques combined with computer graphics could have provided a far better produced book that whilst seemingly aimed at scale modellers could have been greatly enhanced by the use of modern technology. **The battleship uss iowa museum** Except for basic General Arrangement plans of each hull and superstructure deck some sectional views of a 16 inch turret a few unlabeled computer models and 14 small transverse views the entire book is a 'skin deep' affair. **Book The Battleship USS iowa courts** There are no detailed views of the machinery no diagrams of the hull structure not even a single view of the interior of a 5'/38 mounting! I can understand why the 'Bismarck' or 'Yamato' anatomies might be lacking in those areas. **Book The Battleship USS iowa courts** It doesn't make much sense then that even the 'Bartolomeo Colleoni' AOTS which covered an obscure Italian warship and had a much smaller page count blows this one out of the water when it comes to internal details. **The Battleship USS Iowa book store** It only depicts the ship as it appeared during World War II there are no plans of the hull lines and I imagine a lot of folks would scoff at the occasionally crude black and white drawings. **The Battleship USS Iowa epub file** But there's just so much passion and detail on every page whether it's in a wonderful perspective view of the anchor gear plan and sectional views of machinery spaces meticulous diagrams of the shell plating and plans showing all of the tanks in the double and third bottom. **EBook The Battleship USS iowa women's** It reminds me of why I became fascinated by naval architecture in the first place I used to think of ships as strange mysterious things and here were these books which explained in a highly detailed but accessible manner that they were enormously complex machines. **Bookpedia iowa class battleship** It's certainly gorgeous to look at but falls short of the work of John Roberts John Lambert Ross Watton John McKay and the other draftsmen who created the 'classic' Anatomies in the 80s and 90s,
